Golf Course Maintenance



The hot days of August are behind us and the maintenance staff is looking forward to cooler days in September and October. September should be a great month for golf. We have the club championship, and the greens should be in great condition. We will start to lower the rough to its original height when the temperatures start to cool down. I know the longer rough has been an issue through August. The reason we raised the height was to insure the quality of the turf during the hotter months. We appreciate the compliments that we have been receiving on the quality of the golf course.

As I make my way around the course, I have noticed a considerable amount of divots not being repaired on the greens. This is unfair to the players who do repair their ball marks, so if you hit your ball on the green there will be a ball mark, and if you can't find it, please repair one that you do see. An unrepaired ball mark takes two weeks to heal while a repaired ball mark only takes three days to heal. Thank you for your help with this issue. We will not be over-seeding greens this year so we can do a better job of weed control, and we should not have any issues with the greens during spring when we normally would have had a transition period. Hope to see you on the course and as always please repair your ball marks.

Monarch Butterfly Follow-Up

As a follow up to last month's "KWLB Monarch Butterfly Garden at Pecan Park" article, a few of our Weston Lakes' residents asked: How long do Monarch's live?



Monarch chrysalis

The Monarch has a full life cycle of 28 to 32 days, during which their primary purpose is to reproduce. Monarch female butterflies lay their eggs on milkweed, the only plant Monarch "caterpillars" can eat. The eggs are laid singly and generally on the undersides of leaves. The eggs are exceedingly small and are white in color. Each egg is attached to the leaf by an adhesive fluid that is applied to the egg as it is being laid. Four to six days after the eggs are deposited, they hatch. Monarchs that emerge from their pupae as caterpillars live in that stage for about 5 to 7 days and shed their skin about once a day, increasing their size after each molt.

After that "caterpillar-stage" week, the mature Monarch Caterpillar creates its chrysalis where, through metamorphosis, it will re-emerge as full-grown Monarch Butterfly in a few days. Once a Monarch Butterfly leaves its chrysalis, it will live about another two weeks during which it will mate and lay more than 300 eggs before it dies. Only about two percent of the eggs laid will survive long enough to go on to become Monarch Butterflies, then... the whole 28 to 32-day process repeats itself.

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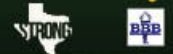

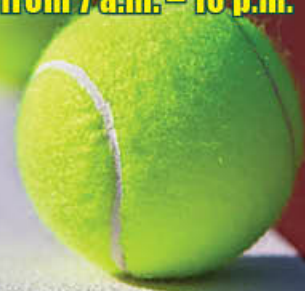

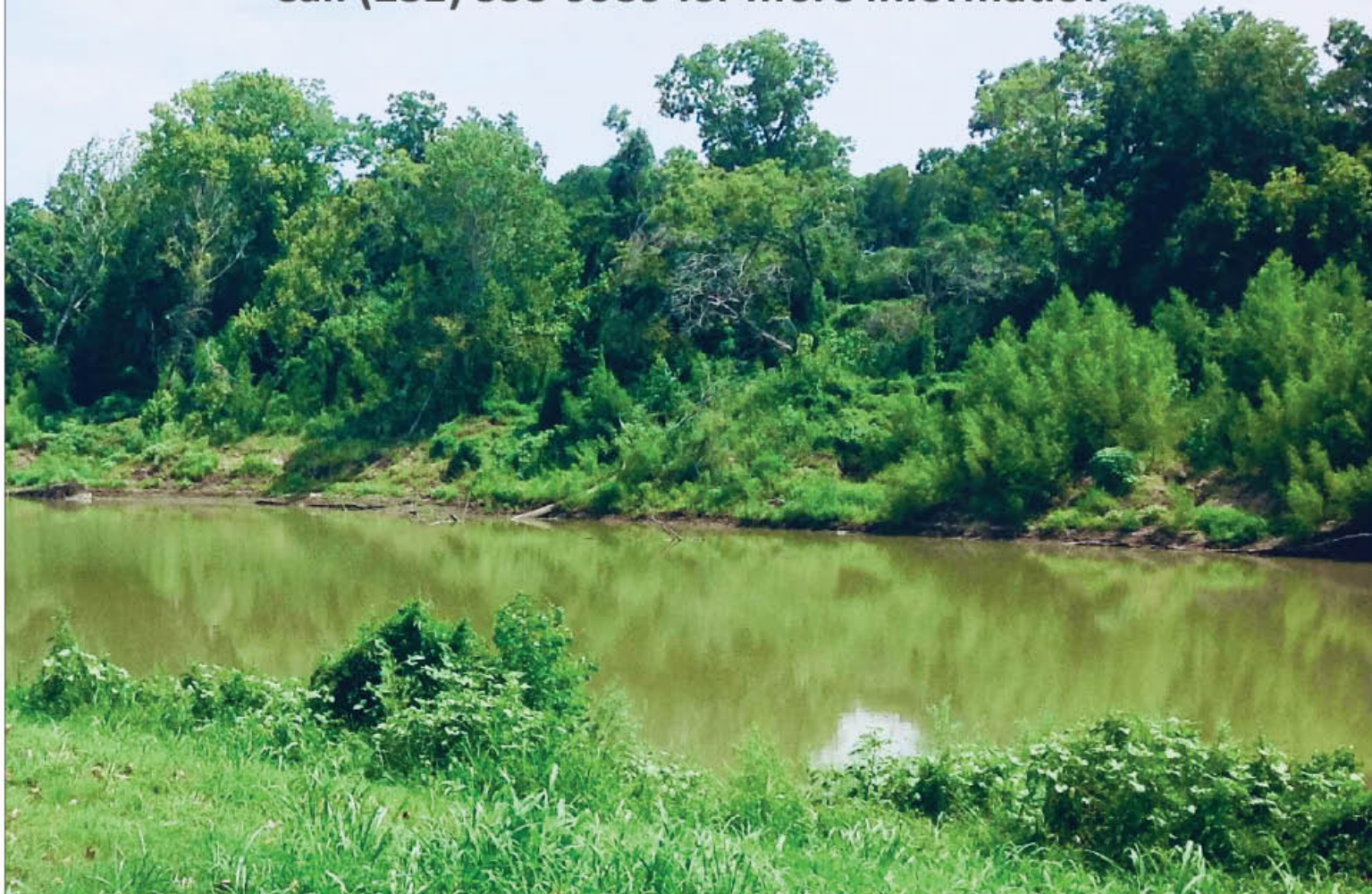
